Changes in Housing Units in Mississippi Counties Per 2022 Population Estimates

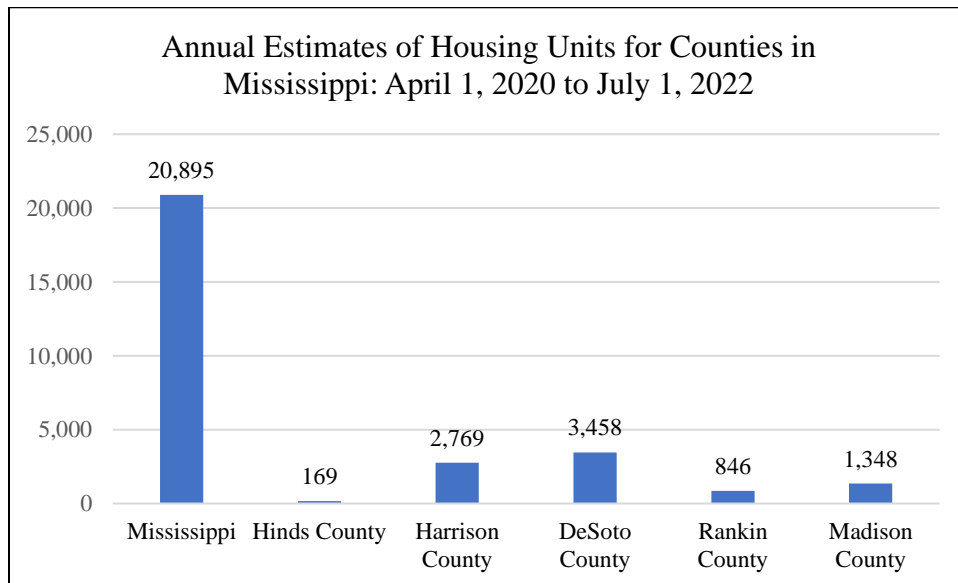
Some Mississippi counties saw significant growth in the number of housing units for the period of April 1, 2020 to July 1, 2022. Hinds County, however, where the capital city of Jackson is located, was not one of them. **Figure 1** depicts the estimated number of housing units in the state (total), and in selected counties. Hinds County had the lowest growth percentage, at .001%.
